ii.Sheriff's Office	<p>PRCS monthly releases have been fairly consistent. The more the monthly releases fluctuate, the harder it is to anticipate caseload sizes. Thankfully, the numbers have been fairly static, allowing officers to use the best supervision practices they can.</p> <p>There is currently an unsuccessful closure rate of 38%. 56% of those unsuccessful closures were for new offenses.</p> <p>Justice System Partners (JSP) did a random review of the cases assessed by the Pre-Trial Unit, and the outcomes will be discussed at the next CCP meeting.</p> <p>Since the PSA began in July of 2018, there have been 2500 people assessed, or about 300 assessments per month. Currently there are 215 defendants being supervised on Pre-Trial supervision.</p> <p>Tulare County Sheriff's Office Inmate Programs Manager, Susanna Reyes, made a presentation regarding 2017-2018 Fiscal Year programming.</p> <p>There were 21 programs at that time. There are now currently 25. Inmates can participate in multiple programs at one time. There were a total of 1,350 inmates that participated in programming that year.</p> <p>Jail population is manageable at this time.</p> <p>The South County Jail is still moving along well.
