Department Updates</p> <p>i. Probation Department</p>	<p>A 6-Month Evaluation of the Public Safety Assessment (PSA) was presented via the web. The PSA is utilized in more than 40 jurisdictions nation-wide. Tulare County is one of three counties in California using the PSA.</p> <p>Michelle Reynoso and Omar DeLeon from HHSa gave a presentation on the Drug/Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS).</p> <p>DMC-ODS is a new model for Tulare County. There are about 30 counties in California that have opted in to the ODS System. One of the critical elements of the new continuum of care is that they will now be using the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) criteria.</p> <p>The goal is to see how they can get consumers in, in a timely manner, how to get them through the modalities, and how to get them the services they need so that they feel confident in their recovery.</p> <p>The DMC-ODS System should take effect July 1, 2019.</p> <p>Staff Services Analyst Reylourd Tan gave a presentation on recidivism, stating what it is, and what the current rates of recidivism are for Tulare County, in comparison to the state and other counties.</p> <p>Staff Services Analyst Amy Story spoke in reference to statistics on the 1170 and PRCS populations for the month of March 2019.</p> <p>Division Manager Tate Rankin spoke about success rates in residential drug treatment for the 1170 and PRCS populations.</p> <p>Supervising Probation Officer Kimberly Mendonca spoke in regards to PSA Outcomes.</p> <p>Supervising Probation Officer Joe Pinheiro shared data on those on Pre-Trial Monitoring.</p> <p>Division Manager Tracye Peck commented on those on Pre-Trial Monitoring as well.</p>	<p>Michelle Reynoso Omar DeLeon</p> <p>Reylourd Tan</p> <p>Amy Story</p> <p>DM Rankin</p> <p>SPO Mendonca</p> <p>SPO Joe Pinheiro</p> <p>DM Peck</p>
