<b>a. Department Updates</b>		
i. Probation Department	The Pre-Trial Assessment was implemented in July 2018.  To date, there have been 1,518 assessments completed. Of those, 5% had a recommendation of being detained. 19% had a recommendation of being detained, but if they were released, to have the maximum amount of reporting. 76% had a recommendation of having some level of Pre-Trial supervision. 21% had a recommendation of being released on their own recognizance.	<b>DM Peck</b>

ii.Sheriff's Office	<p>Year-to-date, the Job Readiness Program known as RESET, served 203 people. 126 of those people have been placed with an employer in the community and are actively working.</p> <p>66 individuals have been released from prison onto PRCS supervision since the date of the last CCP meeting on August 21, 2018. 35 individuals have been released from county jail onto 1170 supervision since the date of the last CCP meeting on August 21, 2018.</p> <p>The Probation Department is now conducting pre-release video conferencing with the PRCS clients that are in prison and are about to be released onto PRCS supervision. This helps with the transition from prison to the community.</p> <p>The Probation Department is also partnering with CSAC to work on a recidivism calculator. Tulare County is the pilot county for this project.</p> <p>Jail population is manageable at this time. The daily average is a little over 1400.</p> <p>The South County Jail is still moving along well. They are currently installing the security system. Estimated completion date is around the first of the year (January 2019).</p> <p>They are still working with the medical provider, CFMG, and it is working out really well.</p> <p>The ACDC program is up and running. It teaches basic electronics and job training. They have had 12 graduates since it started in September.
